Thank you so much for supporting us by testing your children regularly before sending them into school. Your actions have prevented the spread of the virus in several of our classes, for that we cannot thank you enough. Unfortunately, we have been unlucky with one class but all parents involved have tested and kept us informed so that the class teacher is able to plan accordingly – so thank you all. We ask that in order for your child to access remote learning the following day we are informed by 5pm. With the recent change in testing from day 5 that also works the other way – please let us know when your child tests negative. There is no guarantee that it will be day 5 and 6but if a child comes back after isolation and we are not expecting them the class teacher will not have their work ready for the classroom- it will be uploaded on TEAMS. As I am sure you can imagine, to get the work ready for the day is not a 5 minute job so this can cause disruption to the teaching and learning for the rest of the class if this happens. Thank you for your support with this. Spring term 1 and 2 are always get your heads down and get learning. There is not the amount of additional learning opportunities that there are in the autumn term but that does not mean that the children are not having a great time. This term, arranged by Miss McCarthy before she went off on maternity leave, three classes are lucky enough to be having specialist music teachers for the term. Year 1 taking part in ready, steady play workshops, Year 3, much to Mrs Daly's delight, are learning the clarinet (don't forget that your child is able to loan a clarinet for just £10 for the term) and Year 6 are taking part in a music tech programme – using iPads to make music. So far the children have thoroughly enjoyed these lessons.

Last term Hawks got the most marbles for the term. Traditionally, if a house won the term, they would get to negotiate a treat with me, something that the whole house could take part in and enjoy while celebrating being the best that they could be for the term. Last year, sadly, there we no such treats. This year however treats seemed more likely, then restrictions were re-introduced. Having set Hamish and Michael the challenge of coming up with a treat that Hawks could safely all join in – they have! I now have the challenge of organising it! They are determined to keep it as a surprise from their house mates – so if your child is a Hawk, I wonder if you will get the opportunity to ask them what the treat was before they tell you? Thank you to all of the people that are involved in making the treat a possibility. We have everything crossed for fine weather or we might have to postpone!

All tournaments have again been suspended for the term. This is particularly disappointing for the cross country club, who were keen to compete once again at KLB. However, Mrs Hares and Mr Britton have been training hard with the keen group of runners and they will be working on a 1500m time trial over the next few weeks. All of the local school will be doing this and the children's times submitted to Ron White (the man who organised the KLB races). He will be rewarding the top 5 in each age group. Not the same as a KLB race, but an opportunity to see how well the children are doing compared to children of the same age in other schools.

Mrs Piper is keen to get Forest School back up and running after half term, something that many of our children have been asking about. However, she needs someone to support her for the sessions. based on a picture.


