We were delighted that so many parents were able to join us for our remote learning feedback sessions. It was lovely to see you and for your positivity. Thank you all for your support- we couldn't do it without you! We have listened to what you have had to say and will use it to shape our learning as we move forward.

I am so proud of our team, they have all risen to the challenge and are working hard to deliver learning as best that we can to our children – where ever they are. We are still learning and adapting as time goes on. After the initial shock, followed by a steep learning curve we are now working mostly as we had planned, with the odd bump in the road! We would like to say a HUGE THANK YOU to the PTA for buying visualisers for each class. The staff have been so excited about them this week. They have enabled them to teach and model their expectation to the children much more easily than using the boards that they would normally use in the classroom. It has really helped enable them to teach the children as a 'class'. We were delighted to hold our whole school celebration assembly for the first time last week- we weren't sure the system was up to it but it was – what a great way to end out first full week of remote learning, bringing our school together.

We are well aware that some of you are working as hard as we are – especially lower down the school you go. I have been impressed by some of the volcanos that the reception children have created and the hedgehogs in year 2, you are all being very creative! Look out for my letter updating you on remote learning early next week.

The number of children in school are gradually creeping up as critical workers are finding that they need to ask us for help with their children. I would like to remind you that the guidance says;

Children with at least one parent or carer who is a critical worker can go to school or college if required, but parents and carers should keep their children at home if they can.

I would ask critical workers again to consider whether they are able to review their current arrangements and where possible reduce the amount of days that their children are in school, enabling us to support other critical worker families. Please let us know of any reduction in days that you are able to make. Due to the increasing demand for us to have critical workers in school we will be seeking evidence from employers of work schedules and evidence that you cannot keep your children at home.

The e-schools app, if you haven't downloaded this already, please do so. For the school this is a much more efficient, time and money, way of communication with all parents. The school admin team would like to switch over to this fully but at the moment can't because not all parents have downloaded it. If you are having difficulties with it, please contact the school office and they will be able to help you.

As always, if you are having any issues technically please do not hesitate to give us a call and we will do our best to resolve them with you as quickly as possible.
