Benedict continues to demonstrate high expectations of himself and created a range of different rainbows for Miss Busby's Friday activity.

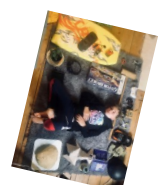
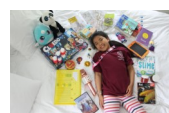
Hamish, Ollie and Maya - demonstrated perseverance with different tasks to complete and achieve a set task.

Imogen is a Superstar for persevering with her handwriting and the huge improvement.



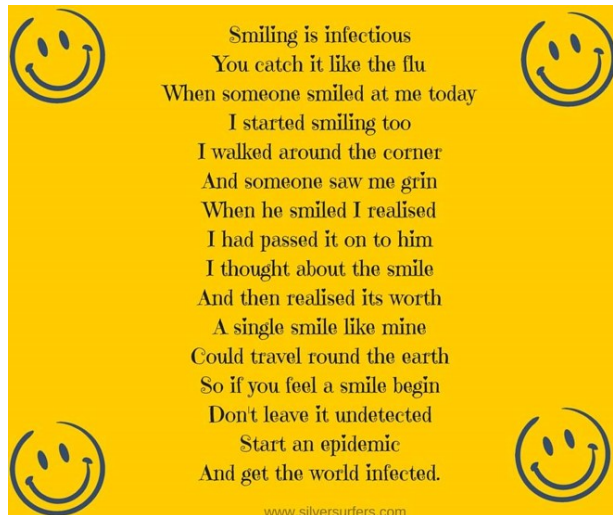
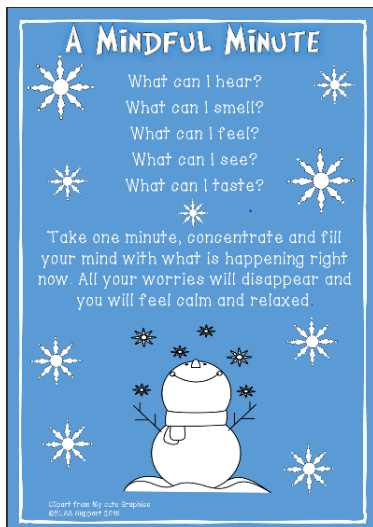


## AMAZING!!
