It is October already and the drop in temperature over night is making for some chilly mornings. As the weather is definitely becoming more autumnal, please can you ensure that your child/children comes to school dressed for the weather — especially on a Friday. Much of the children's learning is based outside on a Friday so a coat is essential.

The rise in fuel costs has meant a rise in the cost to get our children to outside activities. £400 to take a class to Stroud is astronomical. This would mean it would cost about £15 per child just to get them to wherever they are going....so we are looking, whenever possible, to remove this cost by asking for you to support us by providing lifts for the children to local events.

Thank you to all of the parents who have assisted today in getting Year 5 to see the play 'In the Net'. This play has very important messages for the children about how to keep safe when they are online. It is normally something that the children go to towards the end of Year 4 but unfortunately had to be postponed last year during Covid. Our current Year 4 will be going later on during the year.

I would like to thank all of the parents who have volunteered to come and listen to hear the children read and also for coming into support in other ways. Reading is possibly one of the most important skills that we teach our children and as with everything, the more you practise the better you get! We are delighted to be welcoming READ with Me into school. This is a fantastic organisation who recruit volunteers to come into school to support reading.
