Mrs Barron and Mrs Hill have leapt at the chance. As it is the month of May, Mary, Our Lady, they have offered to take the children over to the prayer garden to pray the Rosary there. This is a voluntary activity as it will be at break time. The response was overwhelming and most of the children would like to go!
