Dear parents/carers,

COVID-19: Keeping Safe Online

In the current environment, many of us are using different ways to try and keep in touch with our friends and family and access home learning opportunities. We recognise that during this period parents/carers may feel concerned about the activities and content their children are accessing. This letter therefore outlines resources to help keep children safe from different risks online and where to go to receive support and advice.

Firstly, remote learning can be a great way to continue learning outside the classroom, particularly in difficult circumstances. However, the idea of remote learning isn't always straightforward and there can be a number of factors that need to be considered. In order to provide parents and carers with some guidance, I have attached a document with this email, providing you with some further information and top tips in relation to learning at home.

In addition to this, it is important to have regular conversations about staying safe online and to encourage children to speak to you if they come across something worrying online. They will, amongst other things, support you to talk to your child about a range of online safety issues, set up home filtering in a child-friendly way and set up age-appropriate parental controls on digital devices:
