- At the end of that minute, have them place their hand on their heart and pay attention to how their heartbeat and their breathing feels.



Congratulations to Emily in Y3 for earning her 25th Citizenship Skills certificate. She will receive a golden citizenship pencil when she returns to school. Well done!




