I hope that you all had a lovely half term, we are back to school and well underway with the busiest term of the school year. The children have come back ready to work hard to be the best that they can be.

The staff at the centre commented on how well they listened to instructions and were engaged in the activities at all times. She was once again, impressed by how much our children knew and by how well they could talk about their learning – especially our new Reception Class! That evening, some staff and Governors went to Clifton Cathedral and enjoyed this year's Education Mass. Thank you to Charlotte Daly who represented our school so well. The Mass was lovely and the choir was so impressive.

The following day our Chaplaincy Team headed off to St Peter's Primary School, to meet up with the other schools in our partnership for the commissioning of new members to the team. 
