

If you aren't there when the prize is drawn, we will contact you and arrange how you can collect the prizes, so make sure your number is clear on the tickets.


Easter Event on 24th March

We have received the report from the Teaching and Learning Review. The review looked at our core learning – reading (including spellings and phonics), writing and maths as well as science.

Key points arising:

- This school is providing a high-quality education and, as a result, pupils achieve well.
- The school's strong leadership is ambitious and aspirational for all pupils.
- Leaders are focused on supporting teachers to deliver high-quality lessons. There is strong professional support for teachers, including early careers teachers, to learn and improve over time.
- The school's curriculum for English, mathematics and science are well structured and organised so as to support all pupils make progress and be well prepared for the next stage of learning.
- Pupils' work across the curriculum is consistently of a high standard.
- Pupils' behaviour is exceptional. They behave consistently well and display positive attitudes to learning.
- The quality and presentation of pupils' work is of a consistently high standard.

I would like to thank all of the staff at St Joseph's who work so incredibly hard and are committed to doing the best for all of the children in our school family, supporting them to **REACH** and be the best that they can be. We are so proud of all that we achieve here at St Joseph's.


Class Mass
