Summer term 2, we are already in the final term of the year and what a busy one it is going to be!

As restrictions are being reported as being lifted, nothing in school has changed so far.....

We were really disappointed to come back to school after half term to find that some of the goal posts had been dragged around the field and broken, the cane bolts on the gates that lead into the reception outdoor area had been bent into the ground so far that we are unable to close the gates and some of the OOSC Didi cars had been taken out of storage, onto the playground and left there (fortunately not damaged). They are in later this week deep cleaning the kitchen ready to go on Monday. The children will eat their dinner in their bubble and the kitchen staff will be helping to get meals to the children. As with everything new to our school routine, we will have to give it a go and see how well we get on, always ready to make changes to improve our efficiency. We will of course be working with the School Council to make sure that the children are happy with their meals. I would like to thank all of you who paid your children to help out over half term and send the money into school in the Smarties tubes – I hope that you got value for money! This week Mrs Farrer, from our PTA, joined the School Council at lunchtime so that they could share with her their research and how far they had got with the trim trail project. They prepared a power point presentation to support their explanations and delivered. As usual they did a superb job. I would like to thank Mrs Jenkins for the great job that she does supporting the Council, she really does go above and beyond. Also to Mrs Farrer who is going to support them by arranging some site surveys and quotes. Our First Holy Communion lessons are well underway and the children are thoroughly enjoying them. It is lovely to hear about how well they are doing and how well behaved they are. Syd Gwyer, our Co-Chair of Governors, is

enjoying the classes with our Year 4 children.

Just a reminder to our Year 2 parents, collection tomorrow is changing to the main school carpark gate at 3.15pm. Thank you for your understanding with what we hope will be a one off change.

We are looking forward to next week when Constable Darren Peters will be visiting us to talk to the children about cyber safety.

I would like to thank again, the parents who are using the village hall carpark for school drop off in the mornings, apart from the other day with the unfortunate timing of bin collection over the road, the traffic movement feels a lot calmer at school drop off.

Miss McCarthy has been spending a lot of time organising a fun packed week for the children for Health week. We would like to thank Mr Jordan for volunteering to come into school and do some football coaching with the children, something that they will greatly enjoy. Next week we will be planning a covid safe sports day - it will not however be the same without you!

The children decided which film they would like to watch in their classes today and all of the staff are looking forward to the film night next week! Please make sure that you drop off and collect your child on time.
