### Computers

You may have noticed a recent addition to the OOSC room – a **Wii console**. We are testing this over a period of 3 – 4 weeks to see if the children enjoy it and it can be managed effectively.

The committee took the decision to introduce this console so that the games played can be closely monitored and there it is totally disconnected from the internet so there is no issue of internet safety.

If you do not wish your child to use the Wii, please let one of the OOSC team know. Please note, the children's time on the Wii is restricted to a maximum of 10 minutes.

The computers are now only accessible to children in KS2, following feedback from parents.

### Pre-booking

### Outstanding balances

### General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Update.

As a result of the GDPR coming into effect in the 25th May, the OOSC is undertaking an audit of all data held. Due to this, it may be necessary to ask parents to complete updated registration forms, providing explicit consent for certain activities. We appreciate your patience in this matter.

All reception parents whose children are registered for the Club should already have been asked to sign consent for the OOSC to share details of their children's activities with Reception staff. If you have not done this, please speak to the OOSC team as soon as possible.

**There have been a couple of instances lately where members of the OOSC team have been challenged about the admission criteria for OOSC. The Committee respectfully ask that these kinds of queries are directed to members of the Committee, who set the policy, rather than the OOSC team.**

The OOSC team cook every week with the children. The recipe which seemed to attract the most positive feedback was for **Slovakian apple cake**, so here's the recipe, so you can re-create these treats at home.

#### Ingredients:

400g Flour  
250g butter  
100g icing sugar  
1 tablespoon baking powder  
2 eggs  
2 tablespoons of milk (if needed)  
2lbs apples  
1 tablespoon of sugar  
2 drops of vanilla essence  
1 teaspoon cinnamon

#### Method:

Sift the flour and rub in butter add the eggs and icing sugar and mix until a dough forms add milk if needed.  
Cut the dough into two halves roll out and place one half on the bottom of the tin.  
Grate the apples and mix in sugar and cinnamon (may need to squeeze the mixture to remove some of the juice).  
Fill the pie with the apple mixture and place the other half of the rolled-out dough on the top.  
Bake in a preheated oven 390F for approximately half an hour.
