You will receive a phone call from your child's class teacher on **Thursday 23rd or Friday 24th April** so that you can give feedback directly to them rather than email **SLT**.

As I am sure you are aware, we are also still in school on several days each week and staff are on a rota in order to provide childcare for our key workers. We ask that you therefore keep this in mind, when emailing work in to staff, as there could potentially be a slight delay in them providing feedback.

We continue to keep all of our families in our prayers and also pray for those who have lost loved ones, as well as those who have died during this time.
