Time to start School? If you have a child born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018, then now is the time to apply for a place at our school for admission from September 2022 onwards. You mist complete an application form that is available from the school admissions team of Gloucestershire County Council. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2022. If your child is Catholic, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school by this date.
