SATs Week

Last week, as I am sure you are all aware, was the Year 6 SATs week. Agree with it or not, it is a statutory requirement so our job is to prepare the children the best that we can to enable them to sit the papers.

Last week was a busy one, not only because of the tests but due to the level of scrutiny that we also faced. This is an important part of the process as it provides assurance that we are following the statutory guidance. We received monitoring visits from our LGC, the MAT CEO and the Local Authority - both of which were un-announced.

The feedback was: exemplary practise, best practise demonstrated from all staff involved, how well prepared the children were, how confidently the children tackled the papers and how calm and unpressured the tests were.

Throughout the week the children were saying how much they enjoyed the week, that SATs were 'fun', that they felt confident and prepared to take the tests.

All of this is due to the careful preparation that has taken place throughout Year 6 by our Year 6 staff — I would like to thank Mrs Knight and Mrs Hamlin for supporting the children to 'be the best that they can be' and for doing so in such a way that has saved them from the pressure of testing. I would also like to thank our highly skilled support staff who have been with the children throughout the week, encouraging and supporting them throughout and to all of the teachers, who at some point helped out with the SATs breakfasts and to Mrs Hamlin who went shopping on her day off to make sure there was breakfast to be had!

Safeguarding Review

We recently had Georgina Summers from Gloucestershire Children's Safeguarding Partnership (GCSP) come and spend a morning reviewing our safeguarding policies and practises. This was a rigorous morning of interviewing, pupil voice and staff and pupil surveys. I will write to you all formally when we get the report, however there are a couple of statistics I can share with you from my note taking during the feedback session.

- . Staff at school care about keeping children safe? 89/89 children replied Yes
- . My school encourages me to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally? 89/89 children said Yes.

Key stage 2 children completed the survey and there were 89 children in school on the day the survey was carried out. We were delighted with the survey results and equally with the way children articulated their thoughts during the pupil voice.



More Reviews

We welcomed Tanya Hague and Charlotte Blanche into school last Tuesday when we carried out an EYFS review. As you will be aware, we have been working hard on the environment and learning for our reception children and are grateful for the financial support of the PTA – without which, the environment transformation would not have been possible. It is not just about the environment, it is about the curriculum too – which has had as much time and effort poured into its development too. I would like to thank Mrs Daly for her drive and determination to ensure that the learning in reception is the best that it can be, and to Mrs Frankcom and Mrs Piper for their support.
