Please look after our environment – this is in the newsletter for the second time because some children have still been seen jumping on, then over the dry stone wall and others playing/walking along the wall where the logs are broken.

Concerns have been raised by several parents and staff about what some children are allowed to do while waiting to come into school either at school drop off, pick up or while waiting for a club to finish.

Children are being allowed to:

Climb on/walk on the dry stonewall between school and the bus shelter Walk along the logs outside of the school

Play in the hole in the hedge by the public footpath

The results of this over time is that the wall is being damaged/parts are beginning to fall down, the logs are being kicked off and broken and the hole in the hedge is becoming bigger - at times some children have been seen in the convent garden.

Whilst none of the above belong to the school, we are responsible for any damage that is caused by our community. We have already funded a re-build of the wall and mending of the retaining logs happened only 2 years ago. Not only are these costly to repair, we don't have the money in the budget for it and even if we did – would far rather spend limited funding on resources for the children.

Please when waiting to come onto the school ground ensure that your children are not walking on the wall, logs or playing in the hedge. Thank you for your support and understanding.
