#### As scientists we will...

- Recognise how vibrations from sound travel through a medium to an ear.
- Describe the relationship between the pitch of the sound and the features of its source that produces it.
- Find patterns between the volume of the sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it, and the distance of the source.
- Plan and set up a fair test and isolate variables, explaining why it was fair and which variables have been isolated.

### In P.E., we will be...


• Continuing our multi-functional skills through basket-ball, netball and rugby.
