Phonics screening and Multiplication Check

Year 1 and Year 4 completed their statutory assessments this week. While the phonics screening is completed by a member of staff in school, the MTC is done on an online platform, so we await the children's results from the check. As, I have said before in a previous newsletter the expectation for the children is to score full marks – 25/25. They have 6 seconds to answer the questions before being presented with another one. Thank you to all of the parents who have supported their children with learning their tables. Whilst many of you will not be concerned about this assessment the difference that it makes to the children if they are confident and can instantly re-call table's facts should not be underestimated. It impacts across the whole of the maths curriculum.

Bikeability
