This term is bursting with enriching opportunities that showcase the creativity, confidence and curiosity of our pupils. We're delighted to offer a wide range of *free* curriculum experiences that help every child discover new passions and develop their talents.

Year 3 and 4 pupils are already diving into an inspiring mix of activities — from energetic cricket sessions that are being run by Eric Woodmason from Forester cricket club and dynamic gymnastics with Mrs Dixon, to expressive singing lessons with Alex Robinson that have continued from last term. We have all been impressed with these lessons and what the children have learnt. Year 4 are also beginning their violin journey, embracing the challenge of learning a new instrument with enthusiasm. Don't forget, the children also have the opportunity to hire a violin from the local authority which will enable them to practise their skills at home.

Our Year 6 pupils have their own exciting pathways too, stepping into the world of justice through engaging mock trials, Gary Horscroft paid them a visit last week to explain what the trial would be like and to spark their enthusiasm for it. They have also been exploring the power of sound in their Music Tech lessons, I am looking forward to their compositions and the end results!

It's shaping up to be a term full of creativity, teamwork and new skills. We can't wait to see what our children achieve next!

KNEX Challenge 2026



Last week, Year 5 and 6 threw themselves into the Renishaw KNEX STEM Challenge 2026, and the excitement was infectious. Working in teams, pupils designed and built imaginative structures using KNEX, applying real engineering principles while developing problem-solving, resilience and teamwork. As part of the challenge, they created a mini factory designed to store products, complete with shelves and moving robots. Their ideas were inspired by fully automated Amazon warehouses, and each team demonstrated how the robotic element of their warehouse would operate, showcasing some brilliant creativity and technical thinking. The challenge encouraged them to think like young engineers — testing ideas, adapting designs and celebrating those brilliant “aha!” moments along the way. It was inspiring to see their determination shine. At the end of the afternoon there was a winning design; congratulations to Hebe and Marianne, who will go to Renishaw in the summer to compete against the winners of other local school where they will see how they

get on against this year's competition. Equally, well done to all of the children who used our school values throughout the afternoon working hard to be the best that they can be!

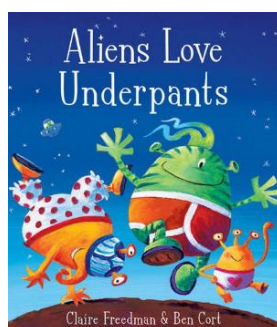
Just a few polite reminders:

- ✓ Appointments are 10 minutes – please stick to your allotted time
- ✓ If you are late – your time with the class teacher will be reduced or we may need to re-arrange your appointment
- ✓ **Meetings are for parents only.** I am happy for your child to remain in the hall with me while you go to meet with their class teacher.

The booking system will go live at **9am this Saturday 31st January.** You will receive a link to book via eSchools. When booking your appointments, **please leave a 10 minute gap between** your children's appointments. This enables you to get to the next teacher on time and helps the evenings to run smoothly for our teachers.

Story Time at the Convent

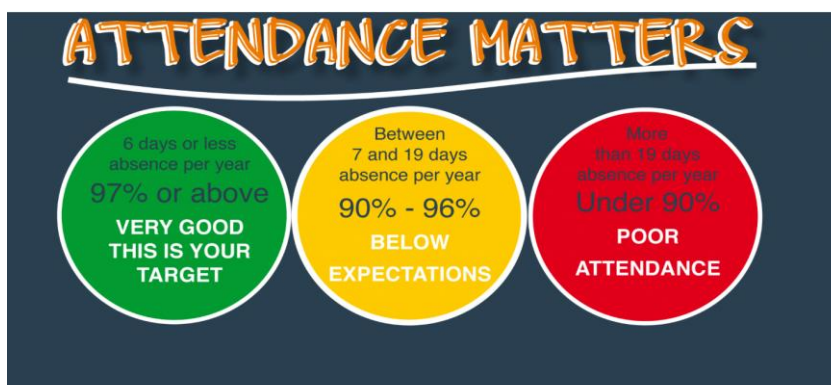
